UNFPA hereby solicits a quotation for the following service:

Research about Sexual and Reproductive Health in times of COVID-19, as a part of the International Sexual Health and Reproductive health (I-SHARE) study in Serbia.

As part of its efforts to promote reproductive health and rights, and improve sexual and reproductive health of the citizens of Serbia, UNFPA CO is initiating a quantitative research about Sexual and Reproductive Health in times of COVID-19. Research is a part of the second wave of The International Sexual Health and Reproductive health (I-SHARE) study (https://ishare.web.unc.edu/) — which is a collaborative project between UNFPA Regional Office for Eastern Europe and Central Asia and the Academic Network for Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights Policy (<a href="https://anstead.eng.network.ne

1. About UNFPA

The United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) is the lead United Nations sexual and reproductive health agency for ensuring rights and choices of all. Population dynamics is one of the focuses of the work of UNFPA since the Fund was established 51 years ago. UNFPA helps countries identify and understand population trends, which are critical to development. The strategic goal of UNFPA is to achieve the three transformative results: ending unmet need for family planning, ending maternal death, and ending violence and harmful practices against women and girls. In pursuing its goal, UNFPA has been guided by the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) Programme of Action (1994), the Millennium Development Goals (2000) and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (2015).

By ensuring availability of data and monitoring and analyzing trends through various research, the UNFPA CO Serbia is contributing to the efforts of relevant actors to reduce inequalities and improve the sexual and reproductive health of the citizens of Serbia. COVID-19 and related preventive measures have a profound impact on all aspects of life, including the sexual health, reproductive health and social life across the world. This study aims to investigate how the COVID-19 health crisis affects family situation, relationships and access to sexual and reproductive health services (such as contraception and antenatal care services) It will contribute to a better understanding of the impact of the COVID-19 health crisis in Serbia on sexual and reproductive health and wellbeing and development of recommendations that could limit the negative consequences of these measures as much as possible.

Purpose of consultancy:	COVID-19 may have a profound impact on sexual health, reproductive health and social life across the world. Epidemics and measures introduced to prevent the spread of the virus that have extended across the globe may influence condomless sex, exacerbate intimate partner violence and reduce access to essential reproductive health services. Population representative research is challenging during physical distancing and lockdown, leaving major gaps in our understanding of sexual and reproductive health during COVID-19.			
	The International Sexual Health And Reproductive health (I-SHARE) study - is a collaborative project between researchers at the Academic Network for Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights Policy (ANSER) and the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM), along with the partner organizations carrying out the sexual and reproductive health studies in their home countries. Investigators in the following countries are piloting online surveys in their respective countries: Armenia, Argentina, Australia, Botswana, Czech Republic, Canada, China, Colombia, Denmark, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, France, Germany, Italy, Kenya, Latvia, Lebanon, Luxembourg, Malaysia, Mexico, Mozambique, Nigeria, Panama, Portugal, Republic of Moldova, Singapore, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Uganda, Uruguay and the USA. More than 12 UNFPA EECA countries will join in the second cycle of I-SHARE			
	The overall goal of ISHARE cross-sectional study is to better understand sexual and reproductive health in selected countries during the COVID-19 pandemic and facilitate multinational comparisons.			
	The second wave of the ISHARE study, is organized by UNFPA Regional Office for Eastern Europe and Central Asia in partnership with ANSER for UNFPA EECA countries (https://ishare.web.unc.edu/).			
	Ministry of Health of the Republic of Serbia has supported the I-SHARE implementation and assigned the Institute of Public Health of Serbia, Dr Milan Jovanovic Batut, as a lead institution. A small team of national consultants was hired to implement the I-SHARE study.			
	The purpose of the consultancy is to engage an entity to conduct the online survey and support national team of experts from the Ministry of Health and the Institute of Public Health to perform the analysis within the I-SHARE study in Serbia. Study should contribute to a better understanding of the impact of the COVID-19 health crisis in Serbia on sexual and reproductive health and wellbeing. The results will contribute to the development of recommendations that could limit the negative consequences of these measures as much as possible.

The survey should include the whole population of Serbia and separately for women and men, main age groups (above 18) and residence area (Belgrade, other urban localities and rural areas).			
	Task 4. Conduct an online survey with preferably 1000 respondents (700 minimum)			
	Task 5. Processing of data and survey results in SPSS no later than 15 days after the end of the field survey (including database weighting). (link to the data in the database with the encryption key for Serbia will be provided to access the data			

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	Task 6. Cross tabulation of data, including calculated statistical values and confidence intervals for all variables and additional processing with relevant statistical parameters, according to the list of indicators agreed with the Institute of Public Health of Serbia);
	Task 7. Develop presentation of study results and graphs and technical report on methods used in Serbian language.
	Task 8. Submit the anonymised database and tabular presentation of results of all questions (N,%), crossed with demographic (urban / rural; Belgrade, Vojvodina, central Serbia, age categories, gender), and other relevant variables, including calculated statistical significance and confidence intervals for all variables, and accompanying technical report, to the Institute of Public Health of Serbia, and UNFPA Serbia office.

4. Content of quotations

Quotations should be submitted in a single email whenever possible, depending on file size. Quotations must contain:

- a) Technical proposal, in response to the requirements outlined in the service requirements/TOR.
- b) Price quotation, to be submitted strictly in accordance with the price quotation form.

Both parts of the quotation must be signed by the bidding company's relevant authority and submitted in PDF format.

6. Overview of Evaluation Process

Quotations will be evaluated based on the technical proposal and the total cost of the services (price quote).

The evaluation will be carried out in a two-step process by an ad-hoc evaluation panel. Technical proposals will be evaluated for technical compliance prior to the comparison of price quotes.

7. Technical Evaluation

Technical proposals will be evaluated based on their responsiveness to the service requirements in Section 2 and in accordance with the evaluation criteria below.

8. Financial Evaluation

Price quotes will be evaluated only for bidders whose technical proposals achieve a minimum score of 70 points per category in the technical evaluation.

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Price quotes will be evaluated based on their responsiveness to the price quote form. The maximum number of points for the price quote is 100, which will be allocated to the lowest total price provided in the quotation. All other price quotes will receive points in inverse proportion according to the following formula:

9. Award Criteria

In case of a satisfactory result from the evaluation process, UNFPA intends to award Professional Service Contract on a fixed-cost basis or ceiling prices basis to the Bidder(s) that obtain the lowest-priced technically acceptable offer.

10. Right to Vary Requirements at Time of Award

UNFPA reserves the right at the time of award of contract to increase or decrease, by up to 20%, the volume of services specified in this RFQ without any change in unit prices or other terms and conditions.

11. Payment Terms

UNFPA payment terms are net 30 days upon receipt of invoice and delivery/acceptance of the milestone deliverables linked to payment as specified in the contract.

12. Fraud and Corruption

UNFPA is committed to preventing, identifying, and addressing all acts of fraud against UNFPA, as well as against third parties involved in UNFPA activities.
