The results from the 2022 Census¹ show that out of a total of 6,526,707 inhabitants, 356,404 people with disabilities² live in the Republic of Serbia which represents about 5.46% of the total population. Observed by gender, there is a higher proportion of women (58.42%) than men among people with disabilities.

At the proposal of the Ministry of Labour, Employment, Veteran, and Social Affairs (MoLEVSA), on 8 April 2021, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the first Action Plan for the implementation of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities, for the period 2021-2022. This Action Plan created conditions for equal opportunities of persons with disabilities to enjoy all civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights. Both strategic documents envisage a full respect for the dignity and individual autonomy of the people with disabilities, ensuring independence, freedom of choice and full and effective participation in all areas of social life, including life in the community.

On 12 July 2023, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the second Action Plan for the implementation of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2020-2024), for the period 2023-2024, which specified all measures and activities undertaken in the specified period. In this way, the operation of the responding institutions was improved, enabling monitoring of achieved results, quality reporting, as well as timely revision of goals and identified measures for better planning.

In October 2023, the MoLEVSA launched the process of drafting a new Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the first three-year Action Plan for the implementation of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities, for the period 2025-2027.

The UNFPA CO Serbia has been invited to provide support, in accordance with its mandate, in the process of drafting the ex-post analyses of the previous Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia and ex-ante analyses of the new Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia, the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030), and the first three-year Action Plan (2025-2027). The UNFPA CO Serbia is engaging a team of five National Consultants to support this process: i/ Coordinator of the development process of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the first three-year Action Plan (2025-2027), ii/ Lead expert for Strategy Development (2025-2030), iii/ Researcher for Strategy Development (2025-2030), iv/ Lead expert for Action Plan Development (2025-2027), and v/ Researcher for Action Plan Development (2025-2027). process will also contribute to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The National Consultant - Lead expert recruited under this assignment will closely collaborate with a Researcher engaged to support the process of the development of the first three-year Action Plan 2025-2027 for the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030). The National Consultant - Lead expert will report to the Coordinator of the development process of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the Action Plan for the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2027), the UNFPA SRH and Youth Programme Analyst, and the UNFPA PD Programme Analyst. The National Consultant - Lead expert and the researcher will cooperate closely with the MoLEVSA, as well as with additional relevant institutions and organizations in this process. The UNFPA's Eastern Europe and Central Asia (EECA) Regional Office will provide backstopping to this initiative by providing expertise and valuable insights into best practices and services in the region related to persons with disabilities. Throughout the entire process, the National Consultants, serving as two lead experts and two researchers, will liaise with the UNFPA CO Serbia to ensure they receive essential feedback from the UNFPA EECA Regional Office regarding the documents they have developed. The National Consultant is expected to execute the following Scope of work: tasks/activities: (Description of services, activities, or Task 1. Participation in the Working Group for the development of the outputs) Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the first three-year Action Plan (2025-2027) that will be formed and coordinated by the MoLEVSA. Develop the first draft of the first three-year Action Plan (2025-2027) for the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) in the Serbian language and submit the document to the MoLEVSA and the UNFPA CO Serbia for review and comments. Task 3. Participate and support public hearings (consultations/social dialogue) with representatives of all target groups and other interested parties to collect information necessary for the improvement of the document. Task 4. Based on the comments from public hearings, consolidate the final document of the first three-year Action Plan (2025-2027) for the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) in the Serbian language and submit the document to the MoLEVSA and the UNFPA CO Serbia. Task 5. Perform any additional tasks as requested by UNFPA leadership, especially within the specific domain where the consultant holds expertise.
