National Consultant - Researcher for supporting the development process of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030)

Purpose of consultancy:

The results from the 2022 Census¹ show that out of a total of 6,526,707 inhabitants, 356,404 people with disabilities² live in the Republic of Serbia which represents about 5.46% of the total population. Observed by gender, there is a higher proportion of women (58.42%) than men among people with disabilities.

In 2018, the Ministry of Labour, Employment, Veteran, and Social Affairs (MoLEVSA) formed a Working Group for the development of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia 2020-2024. The Working Group was composed of members who were representatives of the line ministries, other relevant institutions from the field of social protection, as well as representatives of civil society organizations. The first draft of the Strategy was prepared by independent experts in cooperation with the relevant ministries, the United Nations Human Rights Office, and the Social Inclusion and Poverty Reduction Unit of the Government of the Republic of Serbia. During the process of preparing the Strategy, consultative meetings were held with relevant ministries and institutions, as well as with a wider circle of civil society organizations through round table discussions at the local level. The result was the new Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia for the period 2020-2024, adopted on 5 March 2020.

In October 2023, the MoLEVSA launched the process of drafting a new Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the first three-year Action Plan for the implementation of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities, for the period 2025-2027.

In accordance with the Law on the Planning System, before drafting the Strategy, the ex-post analyses of the previous Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia and ex-ante analyses of the new Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia, will be conducted. This process will be coordinated by the MoLEVSA, which will form a Working Group for the development of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia and the first three-year Action Plan for the period from 2025-2027.

The UNFPA CO Serbia has been invited to provide support, in accordance with its mandate, in the process of drafting the ex-post analyses of the previous Strategy, ex-ante analyses of the new Strategy, the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030), and the first three-year Action Plan (2025-2027). The UNFPA CO Serbia is engaging a team of five National Consultants to support this process: i/ Coordinator of the development process of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the first three-year Action Plan (2025-2027), ii/ Lead expert for Strategy Development (2025-2030), iii/ Researcher for Strategy Development (2025-2030), iv/ Lead expert for

Action Plan Development (2025-2027), and v/ Researcher for Action Plan Development (2025-2027). The results and data generated through this process will also contribute to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The methodology for conducting the ex-post and ex-ante analyses of the effects of public policies is defined by the *Regulation on the methodology* of public policy management, analysis of the effects of public policies and regulations, and the content of individual public policy documents (2020)³. The Regulation defines guidelines and steps in order to choose the optimal public policy, which implies a detailed analysis of the effects while respecting the principles of proportionality and precaution, which are defined by the Law on the Planning System of the Republic of Serbia.

The ex-post analyses of the previous Strategy, and ex-ante analyses of the new Strategy, will be prepared in accordance with the Regulation on the methodology of public policy management, analysis of the effects of public policies and regulations, and the content of individual public policy documents (2020). In addition to various legal acts, laws, by-laws, and research, the Sexual and Reproductive Health of Women and Adolescent Girls with Disabilities Report (Gradimir Zajic, Marija Jevtic, in <u>Serbian</u> and <u>English</u> language), among others, will be considered.

The National Consultant - Researcher recruited under this assignment will closely collaborate with a lead expert engaged to support the development process of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030). The National Consultant - Researcher will report to the Lead expert for supporting the development process of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030), coordinator of the development process of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the Action Plan (2025-2027), the UNFPA Serbia SRH and Youth Programme Analyst, and the UNFPA Serbia PD Programme Analyst. The National Consultants - Researcher and Lead expert will cooperate closely with the MoLEVSA, as well as with other relevant institutions and organizations in this process. The UNFPA's Eastern Europe and Central Asia (EECA) Regional Office will backstop this initiative by providing expertise and valuable insights into best practices and services in the region related to persons with disabilities. Throughout the entire process, the National Consultants, serving as two lead experts and two researchers, will liaise with the UNFPA CO Serbia to ensure they receive essential feedback from the UNFPA EECA Regional Office regarding the documents they have developed.

Scope of work: (Description of services, activities, or outputs) The National Consultant is expected to execute the following tasks/activities:

Task 1. Preparatory work consists of two parts. 1. Develop the outline of the ex-post analyses of the previous Strategy, ex-ante analyses of the new Strategy, and the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) which will reflect the methodology, tasks, stakeholders, and proposed content of the abovementioned documents. 2. Consolidate the list of all relevant reference documents/data sources such as national legal and strategic documents, laws, by-laws, research/ publications/ reports, and other relevant data. The

document will be reviewed by the MoLEVSA and the UNFPA CO Serbia for quality assurance.

Task 2. Participation in the Working Group for the development of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the first three-year Action Plan (2025-2027) that will be formed and coordinated by the MoLEVSA.

Task 3. Conduct consultations with line ministries, independent bodies, and state entities that will not be part of the Working Group for the development of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) and the first threeyear Action Plan (2025-2027). This includes the Ministry of Public Administration and Local Self-Government, Ministry of Human and Minority Rights and Social Dialogue, Ministry of Tourism and Youth, Ministry of European Integration, Ministry of Information and Telecommunications, Ministry of Sports, Ministry of Science, Technological Development and Innovation, Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia, Republic Secretariat for Public Policies, Protector of Citizens of the Republic of Serbia, Commissioner for the Protection of Equality, National Academy of Public Administration, National Employment Agency, Standing Conference of Towns and Town Municipalities, UN agencies such as UNDP, UNICEF, UN Women, and others. Engage with these entities to gather all relevant information regarding persons with disabilities. This collaboration is essential for obtaining the necessary data and insights required for conducting thorough ex-post analyses of the previous Strategy, ex-ante analyses of the new Strategy, and developing the initial draft of the Strategy the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities (2025-2030).

Task 4. Develop the ex-post analyses of the previous Strategy, and the exante analyses of the new Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) in the Serbian language and submit the documents to the MoLEVSA and the UNFPA CO Serbia for review and comments.

Task 5. Develop the first draft of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) in the Serbian language and submit it to the MoLEVSA and the UNFPA CO Serbia for review and comments.

Task 6. Participate and support public hearings (consultations/social dialogue) with representatives of all target groups and other interested parties to collect information necessary for the improvement of the document.

Task 7. Based on the comments from public hearings, consolidate the final document of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030) in the Serbian language and submit the document to the MoLEVSA and the UNFPA CO Serbia.

Task 8. Perform any additional tasks as requested by UNFPA leadership, especially within the specific domain where the consultant holds expertise.

All eight aforementioned tasks are to be executed by the National Consultant - Researcher for supporting the development process of the Strategy for the Improvement of the Position of Persons with Disabilities in the Republic of Serbia (2025-2030), in close cooperation with the National Consultant - Lead expert for supporting the development process of the
